250TH ANNIVERSARY OF THE LOSS OF CATALAN FREEDOMS

We reproduce part of a pamphlet widely distributed throughout Catalonia during these past weeks, recalling the 250th Anniversary of the loss of Catalonia's liberties, on September 11th, 1714.

After briefly reviewing the historical feat of the people of Catalonia, Valencia and Mallorca in their united struggle for freedom and democracy against the Spanish and French forces of Philip V, and of comparing their oppression right after the defeat in 1714 with that endured today, it goes on to say: "We are where we were. Catalonia fell, but it did not die. We have to start anew. We have saved our most precious treasure, our language and culture, and we have done it without schools and without a press. A hard struggle awaits us. Now, as in 1714 we cannot count on help from without, we can only rely on our patient effort and in the tenacity of our convictions. September 11th of this year draws near; let us unite spiritually. Let us make an effort to reduce whatever may divide us and strengthen that which makes us brothers... The remembrance of our martyrs should strengthen us in our knowledge that we have been free men and that we are Catalan."
